Healthy Eating:

1. Introduce measures that address the marketing of unhealthy food and beverages (those high in salt, sugar and saturated fats) aimed at children under the age of 13.

Yes, a Mark Carney Liberal government would support measures that address the marketing of unhealthy foods to young children. In 2022, Liberal MP Patricia Lattanzio introduced Bill C-252, titled the Child Health Protection Act which seeks to amend the Food and Drugs Act to prohibit the marketing of foods and beverages high in sugars, saturated fats, or sodium to children under 13 years of age.

Pharmacare

1. Quickly finalizing provincial and territorial bilateral agreements with the federal government to ensure the timely implementation of the initial phase of the national pharmacare program.

The previous Liberal government delivered national pharmacare, ensuring access to contraceptive and diabetes medication for Canadians across the country.

 Expanding the national formulary to cover prescription medications for heart disease and stroke. A feasible first step would include adding heart disease and stroke medications commonly used by people with diabetes.

Protecting Youth from Nicotine Addiction

1. Implementing a comprehensive vape flavour ban that includes mint and menthol.
