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## Stroke Prevention Clinics Available For Urgent Referrals

We encourage physicians, physician assistants and nurse practitioners to refer patients with a TIA, or with a new stroke but having made a good recovery, to our Stroke Prevention Clinics.

Patients with a reliable history of weakness, speech problems or severe vertigo, especially if symptoms have lasted more than 10 minutes even if there are no risk factors known, should be sent to ER if recent symptoms within 24 hours or referred to SPC if not recent symptoms.

As soon as referrals are received, they are triaged appropriately according to the history submitted. Urgent investigations may possibly include carotid ultrasound, CT/CTA/MRI/MRA echo or Holter monitor. The objective is to assess and investigate the patient urgently. We are cooperating with our neurosurgical and vascular surgery colleagues to arrange urgent carotid endarterectomy when appropriate.

All referrals are triaged by Stroke Prevention Clinic staff. **Your patient may be seen at any of the three clinics. Please fax your referral to only ONE location.**

Please note that patients needing urgent assessment (often those presenting at night or on the weekends) should be sent to the Emergency Department.
