Autonomy, Competence, and Relatedness as Predictors of Motivation after Stroke

Location: Canada

Recruitment period: Until end of March 2024

Description: Researchers at the University of British Columbia are looking to evaluate what factors of motivation impact community involvement in the stroke population. Data will be collected through a series of questionnaires conducted via Zoom.
